I wish you all the blessings of this month when we celebrate the coming of Jesus on



Three of the candles are purple because the color violet is a liturgical color that signifies a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice. The second candle will symbolize faith. The color of the candle for the third week is pink, which symbolizes joy—when we rejoice that our Lord, Jesus Christ came 2,000 years ago and we look forward to the second coming at the end of the world.

As we wait for the coming of Jesus Christ, let us prepare ourselves by acknowledging that sometimes we have not lived up to the expectations of Jesus. What Jesus expects of us is that we follow him—his commandment to love God with all our heart, all our mind and all our soul; and that we love our neighbors as we love ourselves.

On the sermon on the mount, he gave these beatitudes: blessed are the poor, blessed are the peacemakers—theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Let us think about observing the commands of God during this time of Advent so that we can celebrate Christmas in a worthy manner. Be prepared for the coming of Jesus.

The important thing is that we decide to follow Jesus. Like the song says, "I have decided to follow Jesus. No turning back, no turning back." This is what we have to keep in mind; we have decided to follow Jesus and his commandments—no turning back. We have decided to love as Jesus loved us—no turning back. We have decided to follow Jesus and love our neighbors, because he told us to love our neighbors—no turning back.

Jesus said, "love each other as I have loved you.

May God bless you; may God bless your families; may God bless your friends. God bless you always, Amen.



Dear Brother Knights & Sister Columbiettes,




Sorry I did not have a chance to write out my article for the November Mariner, but my family suffered a terrible setback. As I informed you in past Mariner's, my dad had been suffering with Prostate cancer until he passed away on November 16th. The doctor's

found that the cancer had metastasized to the brain and he was paralyzed from the waist down. At times he did not even know who we were or where he was. I have also been caring for my elderly mother who has her own health issues. I want to thank those that have sent prayers for him and I ask for your continued prayers for the repose of his soul. In addition, I have been commuting, via the LIRR, to work in an office where no-one else will go because of the corona virus.

While I am on the subject, I want to bring to your attention something that some of you might not know about me. I have a few disabilities of my own. I suffer from cerebral palsy, epilepsy, hydrocephalus (which is a buildup of pressure in the brain that affects vision and coordination) and amblyopia (where only one eye at a time can be used and there is limited peripheral vision). This is the reason that, when filling in running meetings for the Grand Knight, I sometimes have problems with reading the agenda or keeping order. I am not asking for your pity, just your understanding and help with running our Council. A few prayers would also be gratefully appreciated.

In addition to working in the Council and manning parties at the Hall, I feel a strong obligation to keep up our close association with the Columbiettes. Before the pandemic, I attended their meetings and tried to bring their message back to the Council. I believe that we should be working side by side with the Columbiettes for the benefit of both groups and our community.
