Jesus for 40 days was



Prayer, fasting and almsgiving are the three pillars of Lent.

Prayer is the first pillar. Sometimes, during the Lenten season, people attend more Masses, more prayer meetings and related activities. With this coronavirus, we may be forced to stay home more with our families. This can be an opportunity to pray more with our families. If you have not taken up more time to pray the rosary with your family, think about doing so. "The family that prays together, stays together"—is a famous quotation of Fr Patrick Peyton who made a crusade of the family rosary; preaching all over the world. So, take time during this time of Lent to pray together as a family. Our family prayers can help us.

The Lenten season starts with fasting (and abstinence) - the second pillar of Lent. Every Friday of Lent, you are suppose to fast. Sometimes, you can be excused. Don't, however, make false excuses for yourself, claiming that you cannot fast. Fasting can mean so many things to so many people. Fasting means eating one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal (source: https:// www.usccb.org/resources/Fasting-Lent-Info.pdf). Physical fitness people say that fasting once per week is good for your body strength. The church says, fasting gives your soul strength—it strengthens your soul to be united with God. When you feel hungry, think about the poor people around you that are hungry. In this way, fasting helps you to think about others.

The third pillar of Lent is almsgiving—reaching out to others. Along the same lines as fasting, money that you would save from fasting could be given to the poor. Thus, fasting and almsgiving become connected.

My dear brothers and sisters, in this Lenten season, I wish to remind you of these three pillars of Lent: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Continue




