





that in this March Mariner because we are starting the celebration of Lenten observance.

Lent is the time when we prepare for the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. Lent is the time *lent* to all of us to repent for our sins, to do penance for those sins, to pray more and become united with Jesus in prayer, fasting and repentance. These are the three teachings of Jesus that we must keep in mind as we approach Ash Wednesday. In the Old Testament, people sat in ashes, wearing sack cloths, signifying that they want to do penance for their sins. They observed penance with fasting and prayer.

Today, we are to observe our penance, not just with prayer and fasting, but also with almsgiving. What food and drink we abstain from - what we save - we should donate to the poor. That is almsgiving. Prayer, fasting and almsgiving are the three main pillars of the penitential season of Lent.

Keep this in mind as we begin our Lenten season on Ash Wednesday. Go and receive the ashes on your forehead. Receive God's blessing in your hearts, in your family and in the place where you are. May the abundant blessing of God come upon you.
